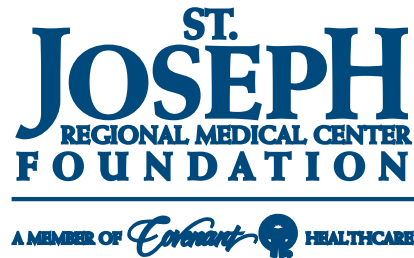
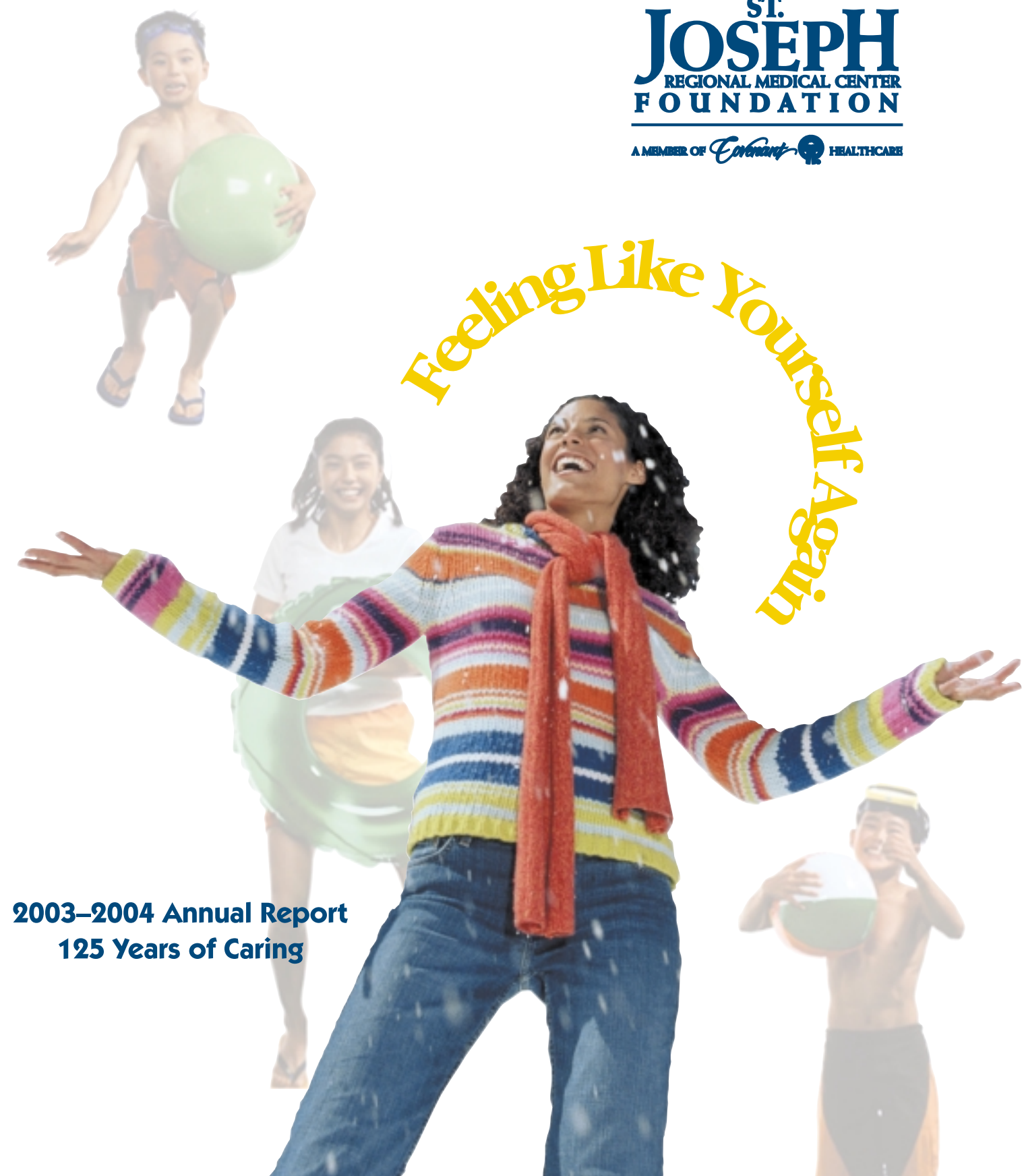

**Taking Care Personally**

Packed and ready to board a plane to Belize, Gil Boese was all business preparing for one of his many conservation trips as President of the Zoological Society.

One day before departure, unusual stomach pain turned into a non-committal diagnosis and a race to St. Joseph for more tests.

“We’ve always been pretty healthy people,” said Lillian Boese, Gil’s wife and Vice President of Planning, Marketing and Development for America’s Freedom Center.

But that day, it was lucky that Gil drove to St. Joseph. His appendix was about to burst, and a very accommodating and concerned staff called in surgeon, Dr. Mala Thenappan, who literally saved the day. Gil was in surgery until midnight.

“When Mala came out of surgery, she wore a big smile and embraced me fully, whispering, ‘your husband is going to be just fine,’” said Lillian. “I can’t emphasize enough what that meant to me.”

But the story doesn’t end there. Neither Lillian nor Gil could know about an even tougher opponent to come.

After a lifetime outdoors, Lillian noticed a few “funny spots” on her chest and visited her dermatologist, Dr. Sidney Herszenon, a St. Joseph associate. While the spots turned out to be pre-cancerous, Lillian was alarmed to find that the mole on her leg caused Herszenon to pause. A biopsy the next day revealed an alarming diagnosis – malignant melanoma.

Lillian asked Herszenon, “is this going to kill me,” and her doctor frankly, but compassionately replied, “I don’t know.” “That was the most honest, beautiful thing to say,” she said.

Because of her recent experience with St. Joseph, Lillian was able to confront her opponent with full confidence. She requested that Dr. Thenappan be called in for her surgery. Luckily the cancer had not spread to her lymph nodes.

“I’ve never experienced such good care from admitting on up,” Lillian said. “Care at St. Joe’s was so much more personal than I expected and I have higher expectations now. We have a very warm spot in our hearts for that facility.”

Today, both Gil and Lillian have a clean bill of health and are enjoying their successes in the community as well as their four grown children and five grandchildren.

“We’re too young not to be a grandma or grandpa, or not to contribute to the community we live in,” she said. “Our lives were saved by these people.”

The Foundation provides support for programs and services that benefit and strengthen patients, families and the community including:

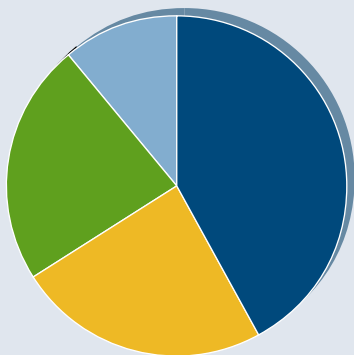
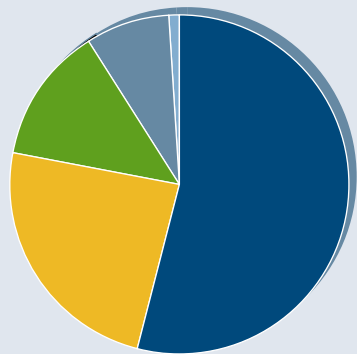
- Medical care, counseling and education on health, nutrition and public aid benefits to low-income pregnant women.

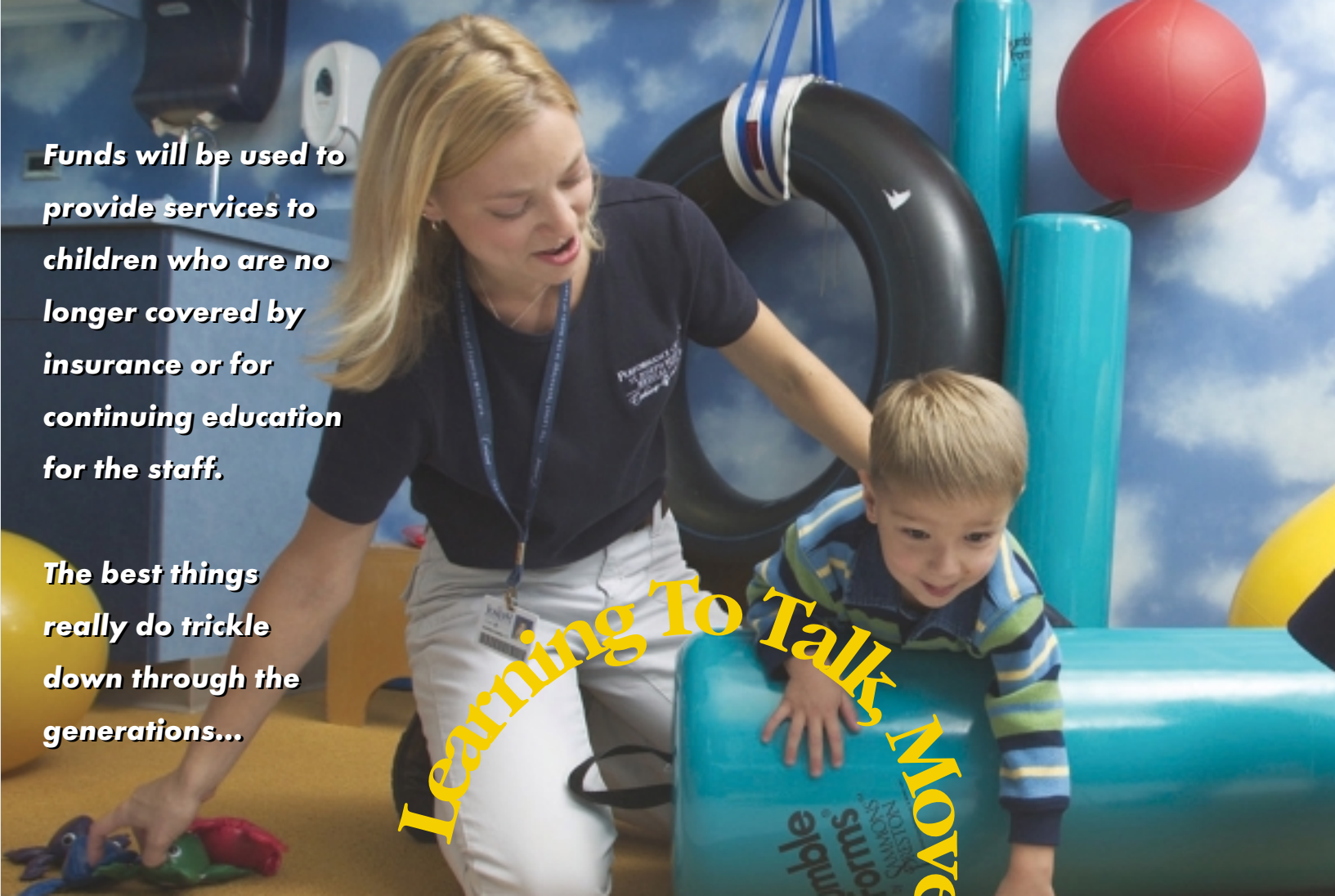
## Our Mission

**Learning To Talk Move, Do**

In the Pediatric Rehabilitation Department of Covenant’s new St. Joseph Outpatient Center, children take part in occupational therapy, physical therapy and speech pathology. They literally learn to talk, move and do routine activities, according to Roberta Johnson, Vice President, Ambulatory Services for St. Joseph Regional Medical Center.

Today, just how they learn those things is a whole lot easier thanks to Johnson’s family, and the living memory of her father’s love for the outpatient center.

“My father loved this place and was here from ground breaking to grand opening,” she said. “When dad went to heaven two months after opening, mom and I decided to donate to St. Joe’s in his name.”

After their donation, others rolled in. Johnson’s aunt and uncle decided to get on board as well, donating significant additional funds to pediatric rehab last year.

“My aunt and uncle couldn’t have children of their own, so they have a special place in their hearts.”

What that meant for Pediatric Rehabilitation was a room full of new toys and objects to help children learn routine developmental tasks like talking, walking, and using their hands for functional activities.

“These children may have learning or cognitive problems, or physical disabilities,” said Johnson. “The best way to get children to work is to have toys as part of day-to-day activities.”

Kathy Stoecker, Regional Director for Covenant Rehabilitation Services said that the Pediatric Rehabilitation Center was designed by the hospital staff, and built for the kids with clouds on the walls as well as primary colors to make it appealing.

Johnson said that her aunt and uncle, now in their eighties, along with her aunt’s brother made a generous donation to the center again this year.

## 125th Anniversary

In 2004, St. Joseph Regional Medical Center celebrated its 125th anniversary – “Changing Lives for 125 Years.” St. Joseph traces its roots to 1879, when three Franciscan Sisters set forth on a mission to provide nursing care to the Milwaukee community. Today, the Center serves thousands of patients throughout Wisconsin and across the nation.

For Sonia Moore, a routine ultrasound at St. Joseph Regional Medical Center turned into anything but. A complication with her cervix meant constant monitoring and hospital bed rest.

Just one week later, at 26-weeks gestation, Sonia went into labor. Her worries were intensified by the fact that she had experienced premature childbirth 14 years earlier. The neonatologist reassured the Moores that with today's advances in medicine, pre-mature babies have a ninety percent chance of survival.

Nonetheless, baby Matthew decided that getting out into the world was a rapid priority. Delivered by natural childbirth at one-pound, eleven-ounces, Matthew Michael Moore (nickname, 3M) was rushed to a special station in the delivery room that awaited his arrival. Seconds later he coughed and Sonia's husband, Craig, overheard the doctor say, “Oh, this is a good one.”

It was that moment when Craig took his first real breath in some time.

“I was worried,” he said. “But that statement set me back on my heels. Maybe this is going to work.”

Suddenly, all the worries he had been harboring were gone. Craig was taken aback by the confidence the doctors displayed. Tiny Matthew was placed in an incubator with a breathing tube for his undeveloped lungs. He stayed in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit for three months, arriving home on his actual due date at just six pounds.

During his stay at St. Joseph, Sonia and Craig were able to visit 24-hours-a-day, seven-days-a-week. The whole experience – the equipment, monitors, and tubes – was a little daunting for the Moores.

“Going home with Sonia after he was born, and leaving him was very strange to me,” said Craig. “They (St. Joe's staff) calmed us with the confidence they had in themselves. I felt totally confident – like we had the best babysitters in the world.”

Today, Mathew is a healthy 13-pound, nine-month-old, who is growing and delighting his parents daily. He is still on oxygen for his growing lungs, and has regular check-ups with the doctors at St. Joseph.

Partnering For Heart Health

"I'm completely pain-free, and I feel like the same man I was before this happened. I've been very fortunate."

Carl Nyenhuis, a 74-year old former mechanic, woke up in the middle of the night with pain in his chest last April. "I took aspirin and went back to bed," said the Oostburg resident, "but then the pain got worse and went up into my chin."

A call to 911 and an ambulance ride later, Nyenhuis was in a hospital in nearby Sheboygan, being treated by Louie Coulis, M.D., the hospital's medical director of cardiac service.

It was clear Mr. Nyenhuis had a heart attack and needed an angioplasty and stents," says Dr. Coulis, referring to a procedure that opens blocked arteries with a balloon and small metal tubes, stents. "But the hospital here doesn't have the resources to do the procedure."

Fortunately, Dr. Coulis maintains a partnership with St. Joseph Regional Medical Center and Thomas Shimshak, M.D., an interventional cardiologist. After Nyenhuis was stabilized, he was brought to St. Joseph, where Dr. Shimshak was already waiting. His angioplasty was a success and Nyenhuis was discharged three days later.

The St. Joseph Heart Care Program provides a full spectrum of cardiology and cardiovascular surgery services designed to help heart patients return to a normal lifestyle. Dr. Coulis's partnership with St. Joseph and Dr. Shimshak made it simple and efficient for Nyenhuis to have access to that high-level care.

"For patients to fully recover, they need comprehensive care, not just treatment of an acute episode," Dr. Shimshak says. "We take a very aggressive approach to rehabilitation, with structured exercise programs and disease management

Today, Nyenhuis has received a few more stent procedures, and is continuing with cardiac rehabilitation, working out on a treadmill, stairs and stationary bicycle. Just as important, he says he's gotten close to the other patients in the program, as well as the nurses and therapists, who have all offered care and support.

"I'm completely pain-free, and I feel like the same man I was before this happened," he says. "I've been very fortunate."
